

Anne Green played competitive slow pitch softball in the state of Minnesota from 1958 to 1988. Her 30 year career began with youth softball and the Minneapolis Park Board at Bohanen Park at age 7.

She continued playing for the Knights of Columbus Youth and the KCYO Scenics, where her team was the Minneapolis champion in 1971 and qualified for the National Championships.

With the Chuck Wagon Americas from 1973-78, coached by Leroy Erickson and again in 1980-82, Anne's teams were state champions in 1971 and qualified for the National Championships.

Anne then played another 7 years in Rochester with Nigon Woodcraft and Manahan and Co. and her teams qualified for nationals two additional times.

Anne was an outstanding left and left-center fielder and was watched and admired by many women who themselves have since been selected to the Minnesota Softball Hall of Fame.

In 1978, Anne hit .422 and drove in 86 runs in 82 games played.

Anne is the one the most dedicated team players and most focused, hard working athletes the sport has ever seen.
